Subject: New Kirkwall Care Facility - Update.

1. Purpose

1.1. This report provides a further update on progress with the new Kirkwall care facility.

2. Recommendations

The Integration Joint Board is invited to note:

2.1. Progress made since the last full report to the Integration Joint Board in June 2023, as follows:

2.1.1. Works are considered to be proceeding at a steady pace, although some minor alterations to bedroom layouts, as well as delays to service connections, have resulted in a revised completion date of December 2024.

2.1.2. Suggestions for the name of the new facility have been received from Kirkwall and St Ola Community Council, following their consultation with pupils of local primary schools.

2.1.3. That residents, families and staff members were invited to vote on the suggestions.

2.1.4. That the new facility will be called Kirkjuvagr House.

3. Progress Update

3.1. Progress on the new Kirkwall care facility was last reported to the Integration Joint Board in June 2023.

3.2. Since then, there has been a further slight delay to the anticipated completion date, with delivery now due in December 2024. Once the build is complete, a commissioning and testing period will follow.

3.3. There have been delays to power, drainage, and water main connections.

3.4. There have been some alterations to the bedroom layouts and en-suite bathrooms, to accommodate safer routes for the hoist tracks.

3.5. The north end of the build is wind and watertight, with plumbing and electrical works ongoing internally, as well as the installation of plasterboard to walls and ceilings.

3.6. The south end of the build is two-thirds wind and water tight, with one link corridor not yet sealed, owing to the need for easy access to the central courtyard.

3.7. The first site visit for Integration Joint Board members and Elected Members of Orkney Islands Council took place on 1 February 2024 and pictures of the build have been shared with residents at St Rognvald House.

3.8. Officers have received suggestions for the name of the new facility from Kirkwall and St Ola Community Council, following their consultation with pupils of local primary schools.

3.9. The proposed names were presented to St Rognvald House residents and their families who were asked to select their preferred name. 37 forms were returned, with the results as follows:

- 30% voted for Muddisdale House.
- 62% voted for Kirkjuvagr House.
- 8% voted for 'Other' and had commented 'St Rognvald House'.
