Electric Vehicle infrastructure currently progressing with funded support from Scottish Government and the Low Carbon Travel and Transport Challenge Fund. Fees for the use of the chargers were reviewed at Development and Infrastructure Committee in September 2022 and an increase was agreed. However, the income will still not recover the full cost of operation which will continue to be a challenge. Packets of funding continue to be provided from the Scottish Government and are allocated to further Electric Vehicle Infrastructure projects as and when this funding becomes available. A recent funding package from Scottish Government has enabled the procurement of consultants to review the EV Charging Infrastructure Strategy. Officers continue to engage with OREF and other stakeholders, this is now business as usual and therefore it is recommended that this action is closed.
