## Subject: New Kirkwall Care Facility Update.

### 1. Purpose

1.1. This report provides a further update on the progress of the new Kirkwall care facility.

### 2. Recommendations

2.1. Progress made with the new Kirkwall care facility, as detailed in section 4 of this report.

### 3. Background

3.1.On 29 June 2022, the Board noted progress made with the new Kirkwall care facility project since the last report to the Board in April 2022 and subsequent briefings issued in October 2021 and February 2022.

### 4. Progress

4.1. The completion date has been delayed, from June 2024 to September 2024, as a result of several issues, including delays in meeting planning conditions, additional works involving service connections to the site, and the weather.

4.2. The north-end of the building is now wind and watertight.

4.3. The floors to the south-end of the building are fitted.

4.4. The timber kits, which form the inner leaf of the exterior walls, will be fitted in the coming weeks.

4.5. It is anticipated that it will be possible to undertake a site visit during the summer.

4.6. Officers have approached Kirkwall and St Ola Community Council with a suggestion that they may wish to ask both Papdale and Glaitness primary schools for suggestions to name the new building. It is anticipated this process will be completed in the coming months, at which time officers will advise Board members of the chosen name for the new facility.
