#### **Road Asset Replacement Programme**

Expenditure Outturn.

Report by Head of Finance.

## **1. Purpose of Report**

To advise of the expenditure outturn on the approved Road Asset Replacement Programme for financial year 2020/21.

## 2. Recommendations

The Committee is invited to note:

#### 2.1.

The summary outturn position of expenditure incurred for financial year 2020/21 in respect of the Road Asset Replacement Programme, as detailed in section 4.1 of this report, indicating an underspend of £70,037 as at 31 March 2021, against an approved budget of £1,046,000.

The Committee is invited to scrutinise:

#### 2.2.

The detailed analysis of expenditure figures and programme updates, attached as Appendix 1 to this report, in order to obtain assurance with regard to significant budget variances and progress made with delivery of the approved Road Asset Replacement Programme.

## 3. Background

#### 3.1.

The Corporate Asset Management Plan 2019 to 2023 takes account of guidance produced by the Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy and has streamlined the suggested framework to incorporate and complement the existing Capital Project Appraisal system.

#### 3.2.

The Corporate Asset Management Plan summarises the Council's aims and objectives for its assets to ensure that they are used in an effective and efficient manner. This has been further supplemented by the Property Asset Management Plan approved on 10 December 2019.

## 3.3.

The purpose of this report is to present an overview or summary of the expenditure incurred in financial year 2020/21 against the approved programme to allow Members the opportunity to scrutinise the spending levels against approved budgets and gauge the extent to which the Council's assets are routinely being maintained and replaced.

## 4. Budget Outturn

#### 4.1.

The undernoted table shows the outturn position of expenditure incurred for the period 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021, against the approved programme.

#### 4.2.

Appendix 1 to this report provides a detailed breakdown of the works undertaken during financial year 2020/21 and is compared directly with the planned and approved programme.

## 5. Road Asset Replacement Programme

#### 5.1.

The Road Asset Replacement Programme realised an underspend of £70,037.

#### 5.2.

All annual capital improvement and replacement programmes, including the Road Asset Replacement Programme, are funded by a top-slice from the General Capital Grant each year. In financial year 2020/21, the annual programme of £950,000 was increased by £96,000 to £1,046,000 in respect of the Cycling, Walking and Safer Streets grant allocation.

#### 5.3.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, works contained within the Road Asset Replacement Programme were unable to begin until late July 2020. Roads Operations were working with reduced resources as priority was given to Environmental Operations. Following changes to refuse and recycling collections, resources became available at the start of November 2020.

#### 5.4.

Following further investigation, some projects were deemed not to require attention at this time and minor repairs were programmed as revenue works. To enable a full programme of works to be delivered, additional areas of work were accelerated from future year programmes.

### 5.5.

Some works cost more than originally anticipated because of resources required as a result of COVID-19 restrictions, and this trend is expected to continue.

## 6. Corporate Governance

This report relates to the Council complying with its governance and financial processes and procedures and therefore does not directly support and contribute to improved outcomes for communities as outlined in the Council Plan and the Local Outcomes Improvement Plan.

# 7. Financial Implications

#### 7.1.

The Financial Regulations state that service directors are able to incur expenditure within approved revenue and capital budgets. Such expenditure must be in accordance with the Council's policies and objectives and subject to compliance with the Financial Regulations and approved schemes of delegation.

#### 7.2.

The development of a corporate approach to asset management planning should lead to efficiencies in the use of fixed assets, together with the potential for rationalisation of the Council's property estate going forward.

#### 7.3.

More detailed monitoring of expenditure on the Road Asset Replacement Programme will result in improved accountability in relation to the deliverance of the approved programmes of work and ensure Members are kept informed of progress.

# 8. Legal Aspects

Regular financial monitoring and reporting help the Council meet its statutory obligation to secure best value.
