Innovation Fund Consultative Group.

Report by Chief Executive.

1. Purpose of Report

To make appointments to the Innovation Fund Consultative Group.

2. Recommendations

- Vice Chair, Orkney Health and Care Committee Councillor Kevin F Woodbridge.

That, as the term of this Council is five years, it is proposed that appointments to the Innovation Fund Consultative Group should last for the remainder of the term of this Council, namely for three years until May 2022.

3. Background

3.1.

The Spend to Save Member/Officer Working Group was initially established in February 2010 with the following remit:

- To oversee progress of the Spend to Save scheme.
- To consider ongoing funding arrangements.
- To consider and review evaluation criteria for applications.
- To consider applications for funding.

3.2.

Membership of the Spend to Save Working Group comprised the Vice Chairs of the Service Committees, together with one other member. In July 2012, membership was amended to include three other members.

3.3.

In February 2015, the Spend to Save Development Fund was renamed the Innovation Fund, with revised operating protocols. The current remit of the Innovation Fund Consultative Group is as follows:

- To oversee progress of the Innovation Fund including progress with funded projects.
- To consider new applications for funding, prior to consideration by the Policy and Resources Committee.

Membership of the Innovation Fund Consultative Group for the period May 2017 to May 2019 was as follows:

- Vice Chair, Policy and Resources Committee Councillor W Leslie Manson.
- Vice Chair, Development and Infrastructure Committee Councillor Andrew Drever.
- Vice Chair, Education, Leisure and Housing Committee Councillor John A R Scott.

- Vice Chair, Orkney Health and Care Committee Councillor Kevin F Woodbridge.
- Councillor Norman R Craigie.
- Councillor Stephen Sankey.

4. Appointments

The Committee is invited to make appointments to the three other vacancies.

4.4.

As this Council is for a five year term, it is proposed that appointments made to the Innovation Fund Consultative Group should last for the remainder of the term of this Council, namely for three years until May 2022.

5. Corporate Governance

This report relates to governance and procedural issues and therefore does not directly support and contribute to improved outcomes for communities as outlined in the Council Plan and the Local Outcomes Improvement Plan.

6. Financial Implications

There are no financial implications arising directly as a result of the recommendations of this report.

7. Legal Aspects

7.1.

With limited exceptions, section 56 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973 provides that a local authority may arrange for the discharge of any of their functions by a committee of the authority, a sub-committee, an officer of the authority or by any other local authority in Scotland. The discharge of functions also includes doing anything which is calculated to facilitate or is conducive or incidental to the discharge of any of these functions.

7.2.

There are no statutory rules in force in Scotland as to which councillors should be appointed to which committee. Councils have a free hand to decide the membership of their committees and sub-committees.

7.3.

A consultative group is not a committee or sub-committee of the Council. A consultative group does not have delegated authority to make decisions.
