1. Summary

4. Background

4.1. A report was present to the Board on 29 June 2016 which recommended and approved the following:

- Approve the Directions.
- Agree delegated authority in line with the attached Directions to further development opportunities that arise are in line with the objectives of the Board.
- Approve the framework for the approach to Directions, to be trialled over the remainder of the current year.

4.2. Following development at the Chief Officer's network, there has been a review of Directions by Christina Naismith, Head of Integration Implementation, Integration Division.

4.3. At the Strategic Planning Session, Members were give examples of other areas' Directions and were informed that further guidance will be issued in November 2018.

5. Proposed Refresh of Directions

5.1. Members who attended the above Strategic Planning Session agreed that a facilitated session would allow Members to better understand the concept of Directions. This session will be delivered in one of the planned Strategic Planning Sessions.

5.2. It was also suggested that both Orkney Islands Council and NHS Orkney have an opportunity to have early sight on any suggested Direction prior to the refreshed Direction being implemented.
